Be Fire Safe Around Your Apartment:

Followthese simples a fetytips and your apartment will remain fires a fe.

- Insureaworkingsmokedetectoris installedoneverylevelofyour dwelling.
- Ifyouusebatteryoperatedsmoke detectors, change the battery every six months.
- Rehearseevacuationsanddesignate groupsforaccountabilityonceoutside.
- Chooseanareawellawayfromthe buildingtomeettoacco untforall in yourgroup.
- Installandknowhowtouseaportable fireextinguisherinyourkitchenarea forsmallfires.
- Whencooking, neverapproachan openflamewhilewearingloosefitting clothing.
- · Don'tleavecookingitemsunattended andkeepatight fittinglidnexttoyour pan.
- Useatimertoremindyouoffoodin theoventoavoid"drycooking"fires.
- Ovensandcookingappliancesarenot designedtoheatyourapartmentand shouldnotbeusedforthatpurpose.
- Avoidtheuseofspaceheaters. If you feelyoumustuseone,alwaysuse

- extremecaution.Keepspaceheatersat least36"awayfromanycombustible itemslikedrapes, bedclothing, and furniture. Checkwith your local fire departmentontheiruse, they may not bepermitted.
- Ifyouhaveaf ireplace, ensureitis fittedwithatightfittingscreenand makesureyourchimneyiscleanand inspected prior to the heating season.
- · Don'toverloadelectricaloutletsand extensioncords.Donotplace electricalcordsorextensioncords underrugs,t hroughdoorwaysorin suchawaytheycanbecomedamaged.
- · Avoidusingcandlesorotheritems withopenflamesi.e.scentedoillamps, etc.
- Ifsmokingispermittedinyour apartment, large ashtrays should be providedandsmokingshouldneverbe doneinthe bathroom. Ensureashtrays areneveremptiedintoacombustible container.
- Keepaphonenearyourbedreadyto call911oryourlocalfiredepartment numberifafireoccurs.Besuretopost thenumberonornearthephone.



Fire Safety for Apartment Living:

Regardlessofcause, the activation of the building's fireal arms system is an indication of an emergency and immediate and orderly evacuation of the building is essential. Upon discovering fireors moke, remain calm.

The following steps should be carried out in order, if it is safetodoso, and if time permits:

- 1. Upondiscoveryofafire, shout "FIRE" to alert those in your living space.
- 2. Ifindoubt,getout!DONOTFIGHTTHEFIRE. Asyouexitthearea,closealldoorsintheimmediate vicinitytohelpconfinethefireintheoriginareaif possible.
- 3. Checkyourdoorbeforeopeningittomakesureitis nothotandthefireisnotontheotherside.Ifyou encountersmokewhenleavingthebuilding,stayas lowtotheflooraspossible.
- 4. Soundthealarm.Ifyourbuildingisequippedwith firealarmpullstat ions,pullthehandleinthefire alarmboxclosesttothelocationofthefire.
- 5. Dial911orreportthefirebycallingtheEmergency Numberofyourlocalfiredepartment.Thisnumber shouldbeattachedtoeveryphoneinyourbuilding.
- 6. Ifthebuildingis notequippedwithfirealarmpull stations,trytonotifyasmanypersonsintheareaof theemergencyifitissafeforyoutodoso.Ata minimum,shout"FIRE"asyouexit.
- 7. Individualshearingthewarningorseeingthefire shouldbeginanorderlyevacu ationoftheapartment buildingusingsafemeansofexit.
- 8. Ifyoubecometrappedinyourroom,hangsomething outsidethewindowsuchasasheet,curtain,etc.,to warnfirefightersyouarestillinthebuilding.Place wettowelsaroundthetop,sidesand bottomofyour apartmentorroomdoor.

- 9. Closeanyremainingdoorsifpossible. This will help to reduce the movement of air to minimize the fire's spread.
- 10. Ifyourbuildinghallwayisequippedwithfire separationdoors,makesuretheyareneverblockedto ensuretheirclosure.
- 11. Ifyourbuildingisequippedwithelevators, DONOT attempttousethemduringafireorfireemergency.

"When in doubt ... get out! Do not fight the fire."

- 12. Whenallpersonshaveevacuatedthebuilding,they mustremainoutsideandatasafeandcleardistance awayfromthebuild ing.Haveacentralmeetingplace whereeveryoneinyourdesignatedgrouptogatherand beaccountedfor.Ifallcannotbeaccountedfor,DO NOTRE -ENTERTHEBUILDING.Immediately notifyfirefightingpersonnelonthescene.
- 13. Regardlessofcause,theacti vationofthebuilding's firealarmsystemisanindicationofanemergencyand immediateandorderlyevacuationofthebuildingis essential.
